Dear host family,

I hope that you're going good and I hope that you'll enjoy reading my letter. I think that my friends and my family would describe me as somebody who likes making jokes, happy and outgoing, but sometimes a little stubborn. Most of the people that I meet find me quite polite, probably because of the education that I received from my parents. My friends enjoy being with me and we laugh and are having a lot of fun when we're together. I get quite along with my family. In case of dispute, I try to learn from my mistakes and to act reasonably. I've got two big brothers, one is three years older than me and the other seven. My parents have a lot of brothers and sisters, that makes me a lot of cousins, thirteen in total.
