- There is some discussion on the costs for mediation regarding Keystone Exams.
- About a year ago, we spoke about the need for a new Student Information System. We opted not to pursue Harris last year due to issues with the system. It is time to revisit the SIS and we would like to look at Harris and Skyward. Harris has increased support and answered some issues with the implementations. We will meet on Thursday and have something for the Board next month.
