# Highlands School Board Meeting Highlights

#### September 15, 2014 School Board Meeting

#### **AGENDA**

Mrs. Fox noted that the School Board meeting was delayed due to an Executive Session for Personnel / Interviews.

#### **ROLL CALL – All present**.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES** – The Board approved the minutes of the August 18 2014 Special Meeting with the corrections being made to the Headers of the Minutes.

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT - No report.

**STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT – Zaire Frison** represented Highlands High School and reported the following:

- **Student Council** members hosted the first Pep Rally with Fall Athletes and Sports being introduced this past Friday. Every Friday, the Pep Band plays in the Commons Area to promote Ram Spirit.

- There are **four (4) AFS Exchange Students** at Highlands this year! We are excited to share cultural awareness and traditions with these students.

- Highlands HS is partnering with Obergs Industries with the **Junior Apprenticeship Advantage** in Buffalo Township. The partnership launches the Junior Apprentice Advantage (JAA) at Highlands High School for the 2014-2015 school year. JAA will be offered to as many as 10 Highlands High School Seniors who pass an aptitude test and are in good academic standing at school. The students will be registered during the school day in courses including Manufacturing CAD & Geometric Dimension & Tolerance (GD&T), Advanced Geometry and Trigonometry, and Natural Resources & Production Technologies. Students will travel to Oberg Industries for on-site and hands-on training at quarterly trips to the manufacturing facility. There is no additional cost to test, participate or enroll in the JAA at Highlands. Upon successful completion of the courses and graduating from Highlands, JAA students will be offered acceptance in to the pprenticeship program at Obergs, starting at a salary in the \$30,000 range directly out of high school. The traditional apprenticeship program lasts three to four years for incoming adults to Obergs, which invests approximately \$200,000 in each apprentice while they complete the program. Many thanks to **Mr. Malobicky, Mr. Santucci, Mr. Sespico** and **Mr. Krynicki** for their hard work in securing this partnership!

The SADD group is busy organizing events for the school year, including a program about dating violence and the annual mentoring morning, which invites individuals in to the school to speak with students about career options.
The Senior Executive Committee will be reinstated this year in order to cultivate a positive atmosphere, promote

positive student conduct and enhance the spirit of the student section at athletic events.

- The PSATs will be offered to every Junior that would like to take the test. The School District will cover the fee.

- Homecoming is right around the corner on October 10. Groups that would like to participate in the annual parade should contact **Mrs. Galcik** at the High School.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT – Dr. Michael Bjalobok reported the following:

- The school year is off to a great start, but with every new year there are some glitches. This year's glitch is already out of the way – I received information about low water pressure at Grandview on Friday. Within half an hour I received an update about no water pressure at the school due to a water main break in Tarentum. With this occurring prior to lunch, it was a problem with health codes and potentially a great mess. Unfortunately, the OneCallNow message regarding the early dismissal did not transmit to all phone numbers provided by parents due to a glitch in the rollover of the student data system this year. We apologize for any unfortunate or frustrating situations this may have caused. This was due to several student data software programs being used. When we are able to roll over to one system this upcoming school year, this will not happen again. We will be testing the OneCall system after an upload.

- Students are currently taking the NWEA assessment tests. This will show true data as they are familiar with the tests now from taking them last year. Also there is no more of a learning curve for the students or the teachers when taking the tests or analyzing and using the data.

- I have submitted the Ready to Learn grant, which could result in double the amount of funding for Highlands schools. We will now wait to see if is approved or accepted.
