Highlands School Board Meeting Highlights

May 20, 2013 School Board Meeting

NOTE: This Board Highlights document includes the actions of the School Board Meeting. It is not meant to be an exact reflection of the meeting's minutes.

AGENDA

ROLL CALL —All members present.

Mrs. Fox began the meeting by reading a letter from the Brackenridge Police Department thanking the teachers and staff at Grandview and Highlands Middle School for a luncheon honoring police for their service.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES. The Board approved the minutes of the April 15, 2013 Regular Meeting.

SECRETARY'S REPORT – Mr. Jon Rupert made the Board aware of an opening on the Pennsylvania School Employees Retirement System Board of Directors. Board members can apply for the seat. Mr. Rupert also read a letter from the Department of Labor notifying Highlands SD that the district will receive a savings of about \$10,000 for workmen's compensation costs due to having a workplace safety committee.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT

Cole Emanuelson reported the following:

- Students in the SADD group hosted the DUI Bug prior to Prom festivities. The purpose of the "Bug" is for students to understand the dangers of driving impaired. Students with valid driver's licenses were able to drive the car in the student parking lot.
- 286 students attended the Prom held on Friday May 17 at the Hard Rock Café in Station Square. Management at the venue commented that students were the best behaved of all the various schools that previously rented the venue.
- Keystone Exams were taken the past two weeks at the High School in Algebra, Biology and Literature.
- Students were honored at the Academic Ceremony at the High School for achieving high academic marks.
- Finals for Seniors begin next week, with the underclassmen taking final exams the following week. Baccalaureate will be held on Sunday, June 2 and Commencement will be held on Friday, June 7 at 6 PM at Highlands Golden Rams Stadium.

Mrs. Fox thanked Cole for his time as Student Representative. Cole will be attending Carnegie Mellon University in the Fall. Mrs. Fox also thanks Chelsea Grinchuk for her time, she attended previous meetings.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Michael Bjalobok reported the following:

- Regarding Prom feedback: The behavior of the students truly represents our community and district so well. Parents, staff and administration should also be commended for their hard work to have the event run so smoothly.

- During the Keystones Exams testing, a visitor from the PA Dept of Education observed and approved of testing procedures at Highlands High School.
- A meeting has been held with administration regarding staffing. All decisions fall in line with preliminary budget guidelines.
- -We are on our way to moving to web-based analysis software for testing predictions and tutoring, these systems will replace 4Sights and Study Island.

Mrs. Fox commented that she and Mrs. Thimons attended the Prom also and the event was well coordinated.

ASSISTANT TO THE SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Patrick Graczyk reported the following:

- A Title I Monitor has been evaluating and auditing the Title I Program at Highlands and will report back to the district about its finding. Highlands likely will see a 5 to 8 percent decrease in Title 1 funding next year. This year, Highlands saw a \$21,000 decrease in funding.
- The Graduation Committee updated the Board with information about questions asked at the Planning Meeting last week. No action will be taken on the proposed Graduation Requirements at this time.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Ms. Misty Chybrzynski reported the following:

- Highlands teachers left the schools and entered the community during a district-wide Teacher In-Service on April 30. Teachers cleaned Tarentum Park, hosted a lunch and Bingo at the Harrison hi-Rise, served police officers at the Middle School at a "Serve Those Who Serve Us!" luncheon, cleaned up the grounds and playgrounds around the schools, helped collect, package and ship donations to troops overseas, volunteered at Animal Protectors and helped customers load groceries at the nearby Community Market. Teachers also either held or planned various events throughout the year, such as the Highlands Gives Back concerts and a Breakfast Invasion food drive, which collected donations and contributed to several non-profits in our area.
- May 1 Highlands held a Proud to Be Public Education rally along Freeport Road at the Middle School. Honored speakers and guests included Representative Frank Dermody, Board President Carrie Fox and Superintendent Bjalobok. Several students performed musical numbers, displayed art projects and Tech Ed creations. Administrators were on hand to distribute information about how important public education funding is to our schools.
- Highlands High School and Middle Schools held Academic Awards Ceremonies, honoring more than 250 students for achieving excellent grades this year.
- Highlands High School earned a Bronze Medal in the US News & World Report Best High Schools Ranking this month. Highlands received the honor out of 21,035 public high schools in the nation. The publication used information from The Common Core of Data Dept. of Education, the College Board, the International Baccalaureate and the state department of Education agencies to analyze high schools.
- Highlands Relay for Life will be held on June 1 and 2 this year. Please join the Highlands Relay committee and community in honor and remembrance of our community members fighting cancer. Food, fun, games, and entertainment will take place while teams trek the track. Proceeds benefit the American Cancer Society. Please support this hard-working committee and the many students, staff and friends and neighbors who are fighting this disease.
- Tarentum and Fawn received recognition as 2013 Banner Communities. The list includes towns or municipalities that are active in the council of governments, host Government Weeks for public

awareness, conduct a citizen communication program or shadowing program for students and participate in a government mentoring project. Tarentum also completed an LED street light project, changing 100 percent of the borough street lights to LEDs, and received the 2013 Governor's Award for local government excellence.
