How Parents Can Support the Common Core Reading Standards

- After reading nonfiction, ask questions about the information. Ex. Is the spider an insect?
- During and after reading, call attention to interesting words/phrases. Ex. Sick as a dog
- Encourage your child to describe how the illustrations within a book support the story.
- Increase your child's reading stamina (ability to "stick with it."). Support your reading by talking through some of the things that make a text complex.
