

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Fluency At Home

-Help your child build speed and accuracy by reading aloud and having your child match his voice to yours

-Have your child practice repeated readings of lists of words, phrases, or short passages several times

-Remind your child to pause between sentences and phrases

-Read aloud to your child to provide an example of how fluent reading sounds

-Give your child books with predictable vocabulary and clear rhythmic patterns so the child can "hear" the sound of fluent reading as he or she reads the book aloud.
